The South Carolina Attorney General's Office reports that more than 36,000 victims report a domestic violence incident to law enforcement annually. They also say many victims feel intimidated and never make a report to law enforcement.

In 2015, the South Carolina Coalition Against Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault (SCCADVASA) provided shelter to 2,769 individuals, non-shelter services, including counselling, court advocacy and support services to 19, 414 individuals and answered over 18,740 hotline calls. South Carolina ranks **fifth** in the nation for women killed by men, according to the Violence Policy Center.
