She conversed with the inmate for more than hour before he finally took a noose from his neck and went to the door to be handcuffed. Her dedication and consistency in her job, according to her Captain, has gained her the respect of her co-workers and inmates.

While Sgt. Tucker was unable to accept the award at the Alston-Wilkes luncheon due to a prior obligation, SCDC Director Bryan Stirling presented the Sanders Award to her and it was received on her behalf by Trenton CI Associate Warden Evonne Willingham.
